RECYCLING AND REFUSE bin-it123

Food (Blue Food Caddy)

Garden Waste (brown bin / PAYG sacks)

Monday 3rd October.

From Monday 10th October, the Council will
begin collecting non-recyclable waste once
every three weeks in the new, black wheelie
bins being provided to all households.

The upcoming change of service is the first
significant change to the Council's waste
collections since 2015. This new three weekly
scheme means that food waste will continue
to be collected each week, recycling and
chargeable garden waste every two weeks
and non-recyclable waste every three weeks.

2022/23 waste and recycling calendars will be
delivered to all households across the district
before 10th October.

LOCAL BUS SERVICES

We are told by Devon County Council that Stagecoach are making significant changes to their commercial bus services in Devon. The County Council have also given notice on a number of supported services including the 5/5A/5B/5C Exeter – Cridton – Okehampton / Barnstaple / Chulmleigh.

Service 5 will, after 30th October, operate between Exeter and Cridton every twenty-minutes Monday to Saturday daytime and every sixty minutes during the evening and on Sunday.

Just one morning peak journey will start from Chulmleigh, Winkleigh and Hatherleigh Monday–Friday. In the late afternoon/early evening one journey will extend to Chulmleigh, Winkleigh and Hatherleigh.

Stagecoach have given notice to Devon County Council on the contracts for service 5A to Hatherleigh and Okehampton, 5B to Torrington, Bideford and Barnstaple and 5C to Lapford and Chulmleigh. These will be replaced by new services:

315: Barnstaple – Bideford – Torrington – Winkleigh – North Tawton – Cridton – Exeter

345: Okehampton – Hatherleigh – North Tawton – Cridton – Exeter.

377: Chulmleigh – Lapford – Cridton – Exeter.

Service 377 will replace service 5C, with a revised timetable. In Exeter the service will leave from Sidwell Street, not the Bus Station. Further details to be confirmed.

Several services in Exeter are also affected, including the H and H2 routes to RD&E Hospital.
