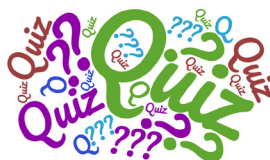

After costs, we made a total of £79.20 on the night to go to the charity, not including our personal contribution. Thank you all for giving so generously.

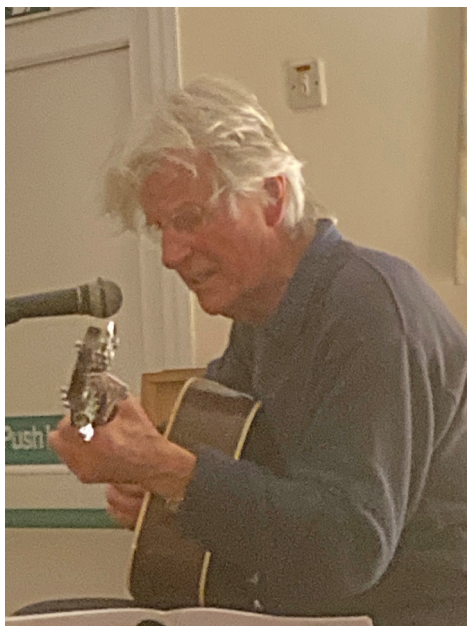

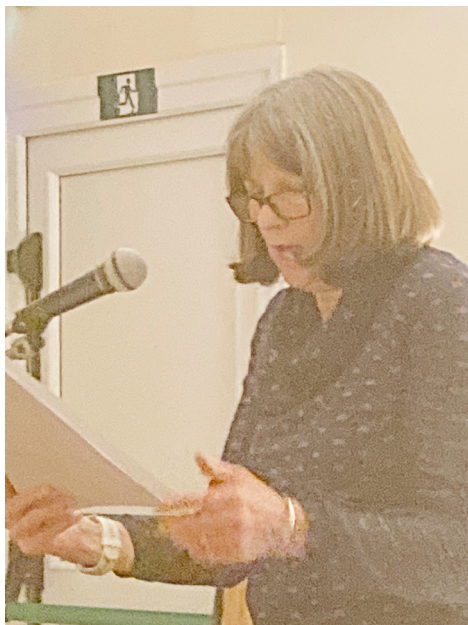
WALKING GROUP
